## Annexure – A: Demographic Profile of Bolangir

### Kalahandi-Bolangir-Koraput Region (KBK region)

The KBK districts account for 19.80% population over 30.60% geographical area of the State. 89.95% people of this region still live in villages. The undivided districts of Koraput, Bolangir and Kalahandi (popularly known as KBK districts) have since 1992-93 been divided into eight districts: Koraput, Malkangiri, Nawrangpur, Rayagada, Bolangir, Sonapur, Kalahandi and Nuapada. These eight districts comprise of 14 Sub-divisions, 37 Tahasils, 80 CD Blocks, 1,437 Gram Panchayats and 12,293 villages.

All socio-economic indicators including population composition and density, net area irrigated hospital beds, and connectivity of villages (due to criss-crossed terrains) to growth centres and service centres are far from satisfactory. 96% of CD Blocks in these districts are either “very backward” or “backward”. 49 CD Blocks of KBK districts are regarded as “very backward” and 28 CD Blocks are considered as “backward”. 44 CD blocks are included in Tribal Sub Plan (TSP) and 16.25% population belongs to the Scheduled Castes (SC) communities as per 2001 Census.

### Demographic Profile of Bolangir

As per 2011 census, the total population of Bolangir district is 1,648,574 of which 831,349 are male and 817,225 are female. This indicates a rise of 23.29 percent in the population of Bolangir as compared to population in 2001. The initial provisional data suggest a density of 251 in 2011 compared to 203 in 2001.

The total area under Bolangir district is approximately 6,575 square kilometers. Average literacy rate of Bolangir in 2011 is 65.50 compared to 55.70 of 2001.

Male and female literacy stood at 77.08 and 53.77 respectively. Total literate in Bolangir District is 944,254 of which male and female 559,065 and 385,189 respectively. Bolangir has 983 females per 1000 males compared to 2001 census figure of 984. The average national sex ratio in India is 940 as per latest reports of Census 2011 Directorate. As per 2011 census enumeration, there are total 206,964 children under age of 0-6 against 191,674 of 2001 census. Out of a total of 206,964 male and female are 106,090 and 100,874 respectively. Child Sex Ratio as per census 2011 is 951 compared to 967 of census 2001. In 2011, Children under 0-6 formed 12.55 percent of Bolangir District compared to 14.33 percent of 2001. Bolangir District population constituted 3.93 percent of total Odisha population.

The district is bounded by Sonepur in the east, Nuapada in the west, Kalahandi in the south and Bargarh in the north. The district has an area of 6575 km<sup>2</sup>. According to the 2011 census the population of the

district is 1,648,574 (up from 1,335,760 in 2001). The district of Bolangir is flanked in the North West by the Gandhamardhan Hills and by the rock infested Mahanadi in north east. The district is situated in the valley of rivers like Ang and Tel. The Important tributaries of Tel are Lanth, Sonegarh & Suktel. Other important big & small towns in Bolangir district are Titlagarh, Patnagarh, Kantabhanji, Loisingha, Saintala, Belpada, Tushra, Agalpur, Deogaon, Chudapali.

Bolangir is traversed by many hill streams and is interspersed with the evergreen woodlands, the shelter of Bison and Sambar. The main forest area stretches along the western boundary bordering the Nuapada, Kalahandi district and then turns to the east running parallel to the Gandhamardan range. This forest track is broken by occasional clearings and small settlements, but it mostly consists of thick vegetation in which bamboo of excellent quality grows and Sal, Sahaj, Piasal, Dhaura and Ebony form the principal timber. The crest of the range of Gandhamardan hills is a plateau, approx. ten miles long, with an average height of 3000 feet.
